VACAVILLE, CA – The 12<sup>th</sup> Annual Jail Break tournament was held over the July 23-24 weekend with winners crowned in Men's, Women's and Coed divisions.

Why Hate? was the undefeated team in the Coed division with a perfect 5-0 record. They scored a whopping 102 runs in their five games played while only allowing 53 runs to their opponents. Why Hate? averaged 20.4 runs per game. Second place

went to Early-N-Often with a 3-2 record. Early-N-Often played consistent scoring 76 runs while allowing 79.

In Men's E action the top finishers were East Bay Hitters at 5-0 and Aftershock and WTD both with 5-1 records. East Bay had the stingiest defense only allowing 5.8 runs per game while Aftershock was the top offensive team with 69 runs scored.
